

The outreach activity titled "The Intersection of HIV and Mental Health" was successfully conducted at Bhalswa Dairy, organized by Red Ribbon Club. The program was designed to highlight the often-overlooked connection between HIV and mental health, with the objective of raising awareness about the psychological impact of HIV on individuals living with the virus.

The session began with a comprehensive introduction in which Volunteer explained how living with HIV can lead to a wide range of mental health issues, including anxiety, depression, and stigma-induced stress. The expert emphasized that

One of the critical aspects discussed was the role of stigma in exacerbating mental health problems for people living with HIV. The expert highlighted discrimination, social isolation, internalized stigma contribute to poor mental health outcomes, leading to depression, low self-esteem, and in some cases, suicidal thoughts. The audience empathetic be was encouraged to understanding toward individuals living with HIV, offering them the emotional support they need to navigate these challenges.

Dr. Sheenu Arora also discussed the importance of integrated care, where mental health services are offered alongside HIV treatment. This holistic approach can significantly improve the quality of life for people living with HIV by addressing both the physical and emotional aspects of the disease.

The session included a segment on how friends, family, and community members can provide emotional support to those affected by HIV. Simple acts of kindness, active listening, and offering a non-judgmental space for open conversations were stressed as effective ways to support someone who might be struggling with mental health issues due to their HIV status.

An interactive discussion followed, where participants asked questions about managing mental health for people living with HIV. Volunteers also provided practical strategies for dealing with stress and anxiety, as well as tips for finding and accessing mental health services.

The activity concluded with a reflective session where students and faculty shared their thoughts on the importance of addressing mental health in the context of HIV care. Pamphlets on HIV and mental health were distributed, and participants were
